## LEAD SCREENING WORKFLOW

**PURPOSE**: The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) require that all children eligible for Medicaid (Medi-Cal) receive a screening blood test at **12 months and 24 months of age or at any time up to age 72 months (6 years old)** if not done at the specified ages.

## METHOD:

- **POC TESTING (in clinic)**: Capillary blood lead test using a capillary tube: Children screened using this method with an elevated Blood Lead Level (BLL) require a confirmatory venous blood lead test. Contamination of blood specimens obtained by the capillary blood testing method can be minimized if trained personnel follow the proper technique outlined by the CDC.
- **VENIPUNCTURE (in lab)**: Often used for confirmation of elevated POC levels. May also be used as initial screening.

## WORKFLOW:

- RESULTS
  - **LESS** than  $3.5 \mu g/dL \rightarrow$  negative, f/u with PCP
  - GREATER than  $3.5 \,\mu g/dL \rightarrow$  report THEN confirm
    - REPORT: must be reported to the State of California through the EBLR reporting system within 24-48 hrs (this is done by nursing staff) Nurses should report using link: <u>https://eblr.cdph.ca.gov/Shared/Login.aspx</u>
    - **CONFIRMATION:** Venous blood draw to quest or labcorp.
- DOCUMENTATION:
  - In addition to your typical documentation, please be aware that the charge capture should automatically add when the note is signed by the provider.
